From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At Marden Vale CE Academy, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- *Expert coaches to work alongside our staff in delivering a broad, balanced PE curriculum as well as CPL for staff*
- *Opportunities for children to participate in out of school hours clubs*
- *Play equipment for the KS1 and KS2 playground to support playtimes*
- *High quality Scheme of work*

Impact Report for Last Year 2023-24

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year was: £17,590

Activity	Budget	Impact
PE scheme of work – Get Set PE To enable us as a school, from EYFS to year 6, to have clear progression in all areas of PE.	£550	This enabled us as a school to have clear progression in all areas of PE throughout the school from EYFS through to Year 6. It ensured that the quality of PE education that the children were receiving was improved. The fun range of lessons that were taught through this scheme also meant that children enjoyed PE more. Assessment has allowed children’s progress to be tracked to identify areas of development within the PE curriculum.
Sports cluster membership	£250	Membership allowed us to compete in competitive cluster events this year against other schools. This included netball, dance festival, tag rugby, swimming, cricket.
Up and Under Sports – external company To enable the sporting experience of pupils from EYFS to year 6 to be widened as well as providing CPD to all	£5544	Teachers’ confidence and skill levels in teaching PE skills and lessons in a range of different sports across the year has raised, particularly areas of the curriculum that staff are least confident or experienced in.

Up and Under Sports – external company Extra-Curricular activities	£3630	This enable children to access structured lunchtime activities and free access to after school sports clubs so that children are more active for longer on school days and become healthier. Also, it allows children to experience a wider range of sports and activities.
Up and Under Sports – external company Curricular sessions	£1300	This enable two classes of children with strategies to become healthier in mind and body with a focus on mental health, physical health and physical activity.
Line marking for football / sports day etc	£300	High quality sports were able to be played on the school grounds throughout the year, particularly football matches and to aid athletics and sports day participation so they can take part in high quality running races.
PE equipment – for lessons and playtimes	£2731.50	This ensured that high quality resources were available and matched the new scheme. It also enabled a range of different sports to be taught. Having good quality equipment is essential for children’s safety, engagement and skill development. In addition, equipment which was worn has also been replaced in particular playtime equipment.
Swimming teacher training	£320	Due to more children being unable to swim when they start swimming lessons we have trained up another member of staff to be able to teach swimming which means we can lower the teacher-pupil ratio in lessons to try and improve the achievement rate in meeting end of KS2 expectations.
Swimming catch up – for KS2	£832	The extra sessions provided enabled more children to achieve the expected KS2 outcome of swimming 25m and in a range of strokes following their initial swimming



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		lessons in Year 5.
Transport and teacher cover to enable attendance to sporting festivals.	£2132.50	This has enabled attendance and supervision at festivals so that children compete as much as possible in festivals.
