### Sport Premium Report 2024 - 2025

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At Marden Vale CE Academy, over a number of years we have provided the following:

- *Expert coaches to work alongside our staff in delivering a broad, balanced PE curriculum as well as CPL for staff*
- *Opportunities for children to participate in out of school hours clubs*
- *Opportunities to participate in competitive sports events*
- *Play equipment for the KS1 and KS2 playground to support playtimes*
- *High quality scheme of work*
- *Booster swimming sessions for children*

*Funding should contribute towards the indicators below:*

- Indicator 1: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Indicator 2: Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- Indicator 3: The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- Indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

To enable playtimes to be more physically active and to give play leaders the opportunity to lead structure play activities for all children.
