Concepts: Compassion, Prophethood, Submission, Revelation, Tawhid

Compassion:

Muslims believe Allah is a God of compassion and therefore they show compassion to others.

Prophethood: Being called to speak out God's message

Giving guidance on God's way of life and setting an example

Submission: Islam means 'submission'

Surrendering to someone stronger but good not a bully

Revelation: Wahy (wahi) is the Arabic word for 'revelation'; it has the underlying meaning of 'guiding' or 'direction'. Something you need to be shown/given by someone else

Tawhid: an Arabic word that is literally translated as the "Doctrine of Oneness."
